

Minutes for HHNA General Meeting  
April 16, 2007

Debbie opened the meeting at 7:08 p.m. with general announcements:  
The Three Rivers Land Conservancy is continuing to link the walking path through Lake Oswego and into West Linn. To assist in this effort pathway bricks are being sold with information at the Pathway Kiosk near the dog park. Brick applications and trail maps should be available here soon.

Committee Updates:

Conservation:

Ivy pulls are a great way to meet neighbors and help nature in the Hallinan Woods and at the entrance to the school. Ivy kills the trees unless it is removed. The next ivy pull is April 28, 9-1 followed by another Saturday June 2, 10-12 noon.

Safe Routes:

Projects in the works include four way stops and crosswalks at Hemlock and Cornell and Laurel and Cornell, speed bumps on Laurel between Hallinan and hwy. 43, a streetlight in the Hallinan cul de sac, and a cost analysis on safe routes along the Laurel Narrows.

Design Review:

Gary Thompson reiterated his committees purely advising role in the design review process. He reported that the city will hold another training session in May to enable attendees then to attend design review meetings.

Mayor Hammerstad addressed the HHNA. She reviewed many recent accomplishments that include financial stability, completion of Foothills Park, completion of the Rosemont trail, plans for the Lusher Park turf field, and the extensive arts in the downtown area.

The three big topics confronting the city now include the necessary work on the sewer interceptor, the at capacity status of the water treatment facility and the structural inadequacy of the city services facility. She also discussed current and future uses of the Safeco property and HHNA members had the chance to have a dialogue with the mayor regarding their hopes and concerns regarding all these matters.
