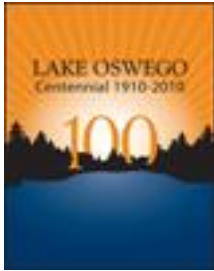


August 25: Community Health and Public Safety & Healthy Ecosystems Fair

Lake Oswego residents and businesses are invited to the Community Health and Public Safety & Healthy Ecosystems Fair on Saturday, August 25, from 8:30 a.m. to 1:30 p.m. There will prizes, activities, a 1923 fire truck, and lots of useful information!

When: Saturday, August 25, 8:30 a.m. to 1:30 p.m. You may visit at any time.

Where: Lower Millennium Park, just below Lake View Village on State St.

Both adults and kids will enjoy visiting the booths, including the Fire Department's 1923 GMC Fire Engine. Also, kids can get a Fair passport: collect stamps from each booth, and one lucky winner will receive a gift certificate from Frog Pond Toys in Lake View Village! In addition, learn about how you and your neighbors can prepare for a natural disaster, take a closer look at a Police patrol vehicle and motorcycle, have the Lake Oswego Trash Team show you how to put less garbage in landfills, and hear from Metro's Healthy Homes about reducing toxic products used in your home. This is your chance to learn about the important role these elements play in keeping Lake Oswego great, and the day-to-day programs that support the community in these areas.

This is the fourth community event as part of Phase 2 of the three-year Comprehensive Plan update process. This

This work builds upon the 2035 Community Vision and conceptual Vision Map developed during Phase 1 of the process to provide a framework for the Plan.

The Fair is hosted by the Comprehensive Plan Citizen Advisory Committee, the City's Natural Resources Advisory Board and Sustainability Advisory Board, and community partners who help make Lake Oswego the great place it is today and in the future.
