Intersection Design, Prep Notes for PAC

To the PAC Members:

Meeting #15 will focus on the 3 intersection options still under consideration. The following notes should help you understand the graphic for each option.

Option #1 – All Asphalt Intersection

- Asphalt is the only paving material used
- Crosswalk striping and dashed guidelines within the intersection center area are from the 60% drawings, they are reflective material
- No special feature at the intersection
- Easiest and least expensive to build

Option #2 – Asphalt Center with Concrete Crosswalks

- Concrete crosswalks break up the otherwise all-asphalt intersection
- Helps emphasize the pedestrian area of the intersection
- Provides a minimal feature at major intersections
- Complicates construction, additional staging time needed for concrete construction, staging and additional material is added cost

Option #3 – Concrete Center with Concrete Crosswalks

- Full concrete intersection contrast with the otherwise all asphalt roadway
- Helps the intersection be a ‘place’ as well as emphasizing the pedestrian area of the intersection
- Makes the major intersections a series of places
- Really complicates construction, even more additional staging time needed for multi color concrete construction, staging and additional material is added cost

Option #3A - Concrete Center with Concrete Core and Crosswalks

- Similar to Option #3 with the addition of a core feature
- In the illustration, the core is just representative of the feature. It could be a geometric pattern or have an art or interpretive theme
- Depending on complexity of the core design, this will add significant time/cost above Option #3
