Gardening spans generations with grandparents teaching grandchildren the joy of planting a seed and watching it grow into food for the family table. Luscher Farm is a place like this - where the 180 organic garden plots are always filled and local residents anxiously wait for the yearly lottery for open garden spaces. Luscher Farm has the sun, fertile soil and space for local residents to grow a bountiful harvest of vegetables to feed families, save food dollars and share the experience with like minded new friends.

Local schools, garden clubs, merchants, nurseries, civic groups and individuals help make the garden a community gathering place and great source of pride. Close to 2,000 volunteers hours are given to support the community garden every year.

The wait list for 2018 Community Garden plots opens December 14, 2017.
