

A Tribute to Stevie Wonder with Paul Creighton Project - July 26, 2017



Join the City of Lake Oswego Parks & Recreation Department for A Tribute to Stevie Wonder with Paul Creighton Project live at the Sounds of Summer Concerts. The concert takes place on Wednesday, July 26, from 7-9pm at Foothills Park. All concerts are free and family friendly.

Paul Creighton is a Portland based vocalist/songwriter/recording artist who has been performing nationally for the past 10 years. Unsigned Magazine calls Creighton “an artist whose tenor has shades of Marvin and Stevie” while the Willamette Week more aptly states “G-dd-mn, can Paul Creighton sing.” Previous frontman for Portland soul-pop mainstay, Intervision, he has also toured with The Motet, Joey Porter’s Funk Tributes, Soul Vaccination, and he has had the distinct honor and privilege to have performed with such greats as Nate Watts (Stevie Wonder), Jennifer Batten (Michael Jackson, Jeff Beck), Chester Thompson (Tower of Power, Santana). Creighton has opened for multiplatinum artists Lifehouse, as well as the Neville Brothers, Little Richard, McKinley, the Dirty Dozen Brass Band, among other nationally touring acts.

Paul received his Master’s of Education from the University of Oregon, studied vocal performance as a Laurel Scholar at Portland State University, and was a student of Tom Blaylock’s NW Institute of Voice. He has received multiple songwriting awards with the Intervision project, including an Independent Music Award for Best R&B song and was a finalist in the John Lennon Songwriting Competition. He currently resides in Portland, OR with his family and is a registered nurse within the Providence Health System.
