Council President Nguyen Withdraws Resignation

Lake Oswego, OR – City Council President Daniel Nguyen withdraws relocation resignation effective immediately.

“After the recent passing of my father, I have decided to withdraw my resignation from City Council and continue to live in Lake Oswego. When I made the decision to relocate my family last month, I had a dream of living in a multi-generational household alongside my parents. It was a vision for our future that I always dreamt of and have been working towards for years. Since the passing of my father, I have reevaluated what is best for our family at this time and we will not be moving,” Council President Nguyen said.

On August 9, 2021, Council President Nguyen had announced an upcoming relocation outside of city limits, causing the resignation from City Council per the City Charter Chapter 3. Section 9.

“It is important to me to continue to serve Lake Oswego and carry on my father’s legacy of service to our community. My commitment to Lake Oswego is unwavering and one I do not take lightly. I look forward to continuing my term on the Lake Oswego City Council. I am committed to the Council and our community more than ever. Thank you to everyone who has supported me and my family during this difficult time.”

The City will be cancelling the Council vacancy process immediately. “Subjecting oneself to a City Council appointment process is daunting to say the least, therefore, each one of these applicants is clearly dedicated to the City and passionate about public service. The outpouring of interest demonstrates the strong commitment our residents have to enhancing Lake Oswego. I thank each one of the applicants for their time, energy, and thought. Even though this process is now ending, I hope they find the door open for future opportunities. There is no shortage of ways for our residents to serve the community,” Mayor Joe Buck said.

Council President Nguyen will continue to serve out his current term, expiring December 2022.

“Councilor Nguyen’s commitment to his community is outpaced only by his dedication to his family. Please join me in keeping him, his wife, and daughters in our prayers and thoughts during this time of family loss. I look forward to Councilor Nguyen continuing to be a strong voice for Lake Oswego on our City Council,” Mayor Joe Buck said.
