





Boca Ratan Drive Questionnaire Results – May 2022



Comments - Where do people walk?

1	I don't know where they are going but some families might be headed toward Forest Hills Elementary. I see dog walkers. I walk down Boca Ratan to get to the library, as part of a loop walk from my house through Tryon Creek Park and as a way to get to Woodmont Park. I feel it's sometimes scary to walk on it and would never walk there at night due to poor visibility for drivers.



47	To and from Forest Hills or Lake Oswego High School. Also, neighbors from the Forest Highlands area doing their runs, walks, and walking their dogs.
48	To Forest Hills Elementary and back, and on a circular walk through the neighborhood (often with dogs)

Comments - Location and Orientation Preference?


1	Mark off a pathway on one side of the street (prefer west) and NO parking is allowed on street. This also eliminates the many parent cars that clog streets and make walking even more dangerous.
2	I prefer no pathway, but if there is a pathway, the west side
3	I am opposed to this. The street is plenty wide enough.
4	East side would be preferable, but my answer would depend on the least amount of environmental (tree/plant removal) impact
5	The sidewalks on Hallinan are sufficient until the curve on Hallinan between Meadows and Upper Cherry Ln.
6	The corner at the top of Hallinan St is a blind corner and AWFUL for walking or biking. This project needs to take that into account for sure.
7	When our kids were students at Hallinan Elementary, it was very dangerous every day to walk around the curve of the road to walk to school. The safest option for the kids would be to have the pathway on the same side of the street as the school so that they can walk safely without needing to cross traffic to get to school.
8	Please try and keep it on one side. I don't have a preference which one is selected.
9	There's hardly any traffic.
10	Put sidewalk on Hemlock to school
11	We live on the corner of Hallinan and Hemlock and have several trees that would have to be killed and removed to make way for a sidewalk, including a stunning cherry tree and a tall tree that is either a Doug Fir or a Spruce. Looking up Hallinan from Hemlock, there are more old-growth trees on the east side of the street, along with a streetlight. There appear to be less old-growth trees on the west side of the street. As noted at the end of this survey, we strongly oppose this project and do not see any reason to put in a "path" or sidewalk along this section of Hallinan Street. If there "must" be a path, please install it on the west side of Hallinan Street.
12	No preference
13	The pathway should match mailboxes (on the east side of Hallinan)
14	It should connect all the way to where the sidewalk from the school ends at the crest of the hill

1	Since I am not in favor of either side of the street having a pathway--I don't see any of the applying
2	Will still walk in street. Walkers don't use the sidewalks we have!
3	I almost never walk from Hemlock up the hill to Cherry.
4	Wouldn't use it.
5	I prefer keeping things as they are. No complaints about the current situation.
6	I do not want a pathway here.
7	Very little or no need for a pathway(s) for the entire section. Might be an argument for a pathway(s) near Hemlock.
8	Many, many neighbors of all ages walk through this part of the neighborhood. It would be used by everyone, young and old.
9	Hemlock street is much higher traffic and would be used for walking, biking, running, etc. mostly for safe travel to and from school.
10	We would not use it, and again, the majority of walkers and school kids walk along Hemlock to the school or to other areas of the neighborhood, not up and down Hallinan hill. The main thoroughfare goes along Hemlock between Hallinan Elementary and Freeponds Park (and further west in that direction). There are no sidewalks in these areas. People walk in the streets, and it has never been a problem. We do not see a need for a sidewalk along this portion of Hallinan Street.

Are there current visibility concerns for drivers or pedestrians on Boca Ratan Drive?

Comments – Usage?

1	Yes, many. Cars come racing around blind curves. I've often had to jump onto people's lawns to avoid getting hit.
2	My concern is getting hit by a car while walking on the street because there are a couple of turns in the road and no consistent walking path. The most dangerous part is in front of 610 Boca Ratan. The road/property curves towards the NE side and a large bush/other plants block the view of both drivers and pedestrians.
3	Yes, sight lines are difficult at curves in the road

4	Two: 658 and 610 Boca Ratan and the corner closest to Atwater
5	Yes, especially as you head towards downtown on Boca Raton.
6	The corner transition to Atwater is dangerous.
7	Yes

9	Only if you drive too quickly- I've walked that road hundreds of times- people just need to slow down a bit
10	At the top and at Atwater
11	Yes, hard to see pedestrians around turns
12	Yes
13	Right turn on Boca Ratan at top of the hill.
14	Yes. The curve at Tippecanoe is a blind curve and dangerous to pedestrians and drivers
15	Yes
16	Where Boca Ratan turns west towards Atwater - the corner on the west side has visibility concerns
17	Cars are parked on the road, and you can't see people. It's also dark.
18	On curves at top of hills, especially when there is a car there.
19	At the top of the hill by Bonniebrae, there needs to be a stop sign on Boca Ratan
20	Yes.
21	Multiple blind corners on hills with cars speeding down blind.
22	Yes! So many blind corners and speedy cars trying to get around the country club.
23	No
24	The corner of Boca Ratan Drive when it turns into Atwater
25	Yes
26	Yes, it is very difficult to see families and children on that route that are walking to school.
27	Yes, around the curves.
28	Yes, on the south corner (90degree turn) of the stretch
29	In the middle part of Boca Ratan, twisty part of the road.
30	Yes! The major jogs in the road create significant visibility issues, especially if there are cars parked on the road.
31	Yes! A very stressful place to walk with some blind curves
32	Yes, there are numerous blind spots where pedestrians cannot be seen by vehicles. I have experienced this as both a pedestrian and a driver.
33	Absolutely! There's one curve eastbound, and one curve westbound where drivers have zero visibility of pedestrians.
34	Sometimes people are in the street to the point it's not safe
35	No
36	Absolutely
37	The southern portion of Boca Ratan Drive has a sharp curve
38	On the corner of Boca Ratan next to 440 and 420 Boca Ratan, there is poor visibility.
39	Yes, seeing walkers can be a challenge
40	In front of 610 boca ratan
41	Yes. The curve connecting Atwater/Boca Ratan is sharp; it's a blind turn (at the speed limit) going towards Atwater, and drivers turning onto Boca Ratan more often than not use half the oncoming lane to make their turn less sharp while maintaining speed. This curve has no pedestrian walkway but there's pavement on both sides. Separately, the 'bump' halfway down Boca Ratan makes an extremely dangerous blind spot for drivers & pedestrians.

42	Yes. Several blind curves.
43	No
44	Yes, numerous blind corners and large vehicle traffic
45	As Boca Ratan turns onto Atwater the corner on the west side is a blind corner and overgrown. Cars or bikes frequently speed down Atwater and then make a sharp left turn onto Boca Ratan.
46	Yes, there is a sharp corner that makes it hard to see pedestrians
47	None.
48	Most of us walk on the east side since it seems to have a bit more visibility. There are a few blinds spot though. I am very watchful driving on this road since people tend to walk on both sides. Seeing them on the west side is more difficult.

50	Yes, around multiple blind corners/ turns right now where there are no sidewalks. Also, a lot of cars do not substantially slow down around curves, and they do not stay on the appropriate side of the street (they drive over the yellow line)

52	Mostly just near the corner with Atwater
53	Yes, some of the curves, especially in areas with no sidewalk.
54	Yes, I walk the route every day, rain, or shine. Cars drive at high speed and there is fog after the rain in the mornings. I and my kids wear safety vests during our walks.
55	MAJOR concerns at the turn, outside of 440 Boca Ratan! absolutely don't have a walkway on the inner side of that turn.
56	Yes!
57	Yes. There are blind curves and no shoulders.
58	Yes, the meander or chicane in front of 610 Boca Ratan creates dangerous situations for pedestrians as drivers take it too fast and too close to the curb
59	Blind S-curves along Boca Ratan.
60	Visibility concerns & parking concerns on Douglas Circle (North section of Douglas Circle). The South section of Douglas Circle would work much better
61	No, I drive there regularly, by day & night
62	No
63	Yes, at Douglas Cr & Twin Fir
64	Yes, some overgrowth blocks the view of people walking on the shoulder
65	At the top of Douglas Circle (where it intersects Lanewood)
66	Corner of Twin Fir and Douglas at Stop sign
67	Corner of Lanewood & Douglas Circle sometimes
68	At the intersection of Lanewood & Douglas Circle
69	No for the driver - yes for pedestrians
70	Corner of Lanewood & Boones Way, if driving south on Boones Way at Lanewood you cannot see left for bushes/trees on the NW side the of intersection

1	I don't park there. Most people use their driveways or park near the curb in front of their houses. Parking isn't an issue.

Comments – Usage?	
1	I'm sure many neighbors will be distressed to see their lovely, cultivated gardens cut back to make room for sidewalks. Most yards on Boca have long-established decorative plantings.
2	I have not talked to any neighbors about their preference for preserving any landscaping. All bushes/plants along Boca Ratan where the road curves need to be cut back, so they don't impede the visibility of drivers and pedestrians.
3	we just installed a retaining wall on the south side of our property that we would like to maintain.
4	The vegetation on the west side of Boca Ratan at the corner and along Boca Ratan. Additionally, the City owns property along Bonnie Brae - the sidewalk is barely walkable because of vegetation overgrowth, and the weeds and invasives are out of control.5 The islands on Bonnie Brae need trees replaced - the City seems to take out the dead ones eventually, but nothing is being replaced. There are also two islands on Briercliff that are only maintained when someone calls City Hall. These need to be on regular maintenance with the islands and the strips along the side of the road on Bonnie Brae and Boca Ratan.
5	We have a lot of unstable sweet gums in the street median that I would not miss. It would be nice to switch to natives.
