GET TO THE ROOT OF TREE QUESTIONS

LAKE OSWEGO – City staff will be on hand with applicable brochures and documents to help demystify all things arboreal at a “Tree Talk” on Wednesday, April 5, at 7 p.m., in Lake Oswego City Hall.

With trees so prominently featured across the landscape of the Lake Oswego community, questions about applicable rules, regulations, and best practices can abound. At the Tree Talk, staff will provide answers to frequently asked questions, and attendees will have a chance to ask questions of their own.

The Tree Talk is intended to help those who may be concerned about a hazard tree, need to remove a tree, want to plant a tree, or plan to prune trees. This free event is open to Lake Oswego residents and no registration is required. Lake Oswego City Hall is located at 380 A Avenue, and the meeting will be held in Council Chambers.

Several events are planned in conjunction with the City’s celebration of Arbor Week, including the Tree Talk, culminating in a tree planting service project at Springbrook Park on April 8.
