PrepLO report to NA chairs

May 18, 2019

Challenge: to have all of our neighborhoods organized and citizens prepared by **2022**.

These are the facilities that our governmental agencies will have in place by then which are built to survive a 9.0 earthquake and be functional afterwards:

- New sewer interceptor
- New water treatment plant and backbone of system
- New Tryon Creek wastewater treatment plant
- New maintenance facility
- New county-wide communications network
- New City Hall with police/LOCOM facility
- At least one building on most school campuses to serve as an emergency center

PrepLO's job is to assist you in preparing your neighborhoods, and to interface with the government agencies. Yours is to find someone in your neighborhood to lead the effort. That effort includes:

- Encouraging individual households to make their own preparations
- Encouraging Map Your Neighborhood meetings on every block
- Creating a Neighborhood Emergency Plan to handle communications, shelter and medical care
