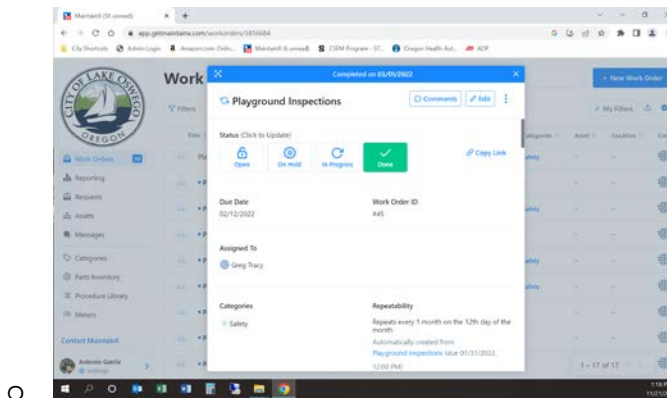


Playground Inspections Protocols

Lake Oswego Parks and Recreation use the following procedures can help us create a safer playground environment for all children. All playgrounds are inspected monthly

General Procedures

- A yearly schedule is published showing the months that each inspector is responsible for performing the monthly playground inspections.
- Each inspector is a Certified Playground Safety Inspector (CPSI) trained and qualified.
- MaintainX contain customized, fillable forms for each of our 15 different playgrounds that allows inspectors to use smartphones to document the inspections.



- The items listed to inspect include:
 - Playgrounds for 2-5-year old and 5-12-year old
 - Hardware
 - Collars
 - Platforms
 - Climber
 - Slide
 - Site Condition (i.e. chip fiber, litter, drainage, graffiti/vandalism)
 - Specific equipment inspections (i.e tire swing, standing spinner, hanging spinner and drums)
- The inspector then is able to not Pass, Flag, or Fail for each of the components of the playground that are being inspected.

- MaintainX will compile a list of all failed items and the facilities crew leader can then make repairs or order parts as needed.
- Repairs are noted and the component is then marked as a Pass.
- Repairs are assigned to a staff member for repair or follow up monitoring.
