- **Shop at a Latinx or Hispanic-owned business**
- **Check out local public art by a Latinx or Hispanic artist.** For example, visit Hector H. Hernandez’s Wilco mural, located at Jean Way and Lower Boones Ferry Road; Huberto Maestas’s sculpture entitled “Polar Journey,” located near the corner of 1st and B; and Amyas Maestas’s sculpture entitled “Amyas & Soleil,” located at the corner of 1st and Evergreen.
- **Learn about how to be an ally to the Hispanic community.** There are many ways to be an ally to the Hispanic community, and support at every level counts! Consider the various ways that you can take action.
