Sidney's farming story began in California, where summers spent at farm camps sparked a lifelong love for agriculture. Since 2012, she has worked on organic vegetable and livestock farms from New England to the Willamette Valley. Now settled back on the West Coast, Sidney is eager to farm in Luscher Farm's unique setting, straddling urban and rural landscapes. "This place is so open to the public—it's the perfect opportunity to foster community connections," she said. Sidney cherishes her work's daily connection to nature and has a soft spot for bell peppers, especially dipped in hummus.

Braedon, a Tigard native and Tualatin High School alum, began farming in 2019. His journey started in an orchard, where the serene interplay of sunlight and rustling leaves inspired him to pursue a career in agriculture. Since then, he has honed his skills on regenerative livestock farms and diversified vegetable farms. "I'm honored to feed the community that raised me," Braedon shared, expressing his excitement for creating meaningful relationships with CSA members. His favorite part of farming? Breathing fresh air, enjoying quiet mornings, and snacking on herbs like basil and cilantro, which he loves to transform into creamy yogurt-based dressings. Together, Braedon and Sidney are excited to continue Luscher Farm's legacy of sustainable farming and community engagement.
