Can you find everything on this list?

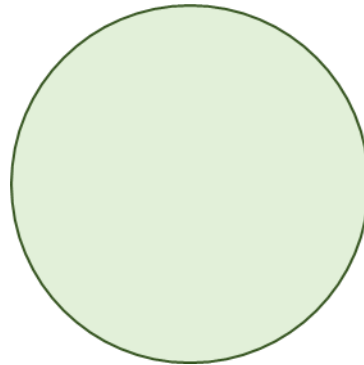
- A cone from an evergreen tree
