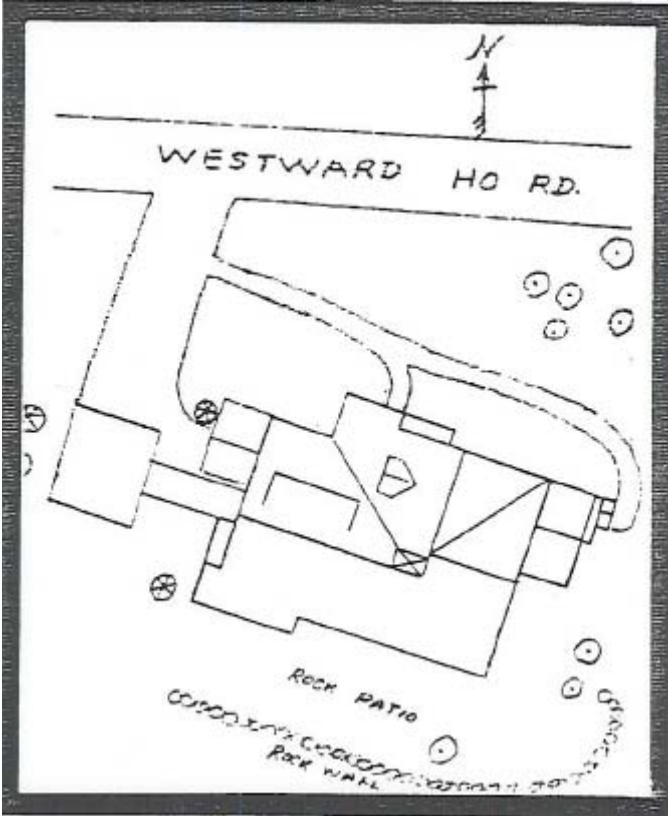
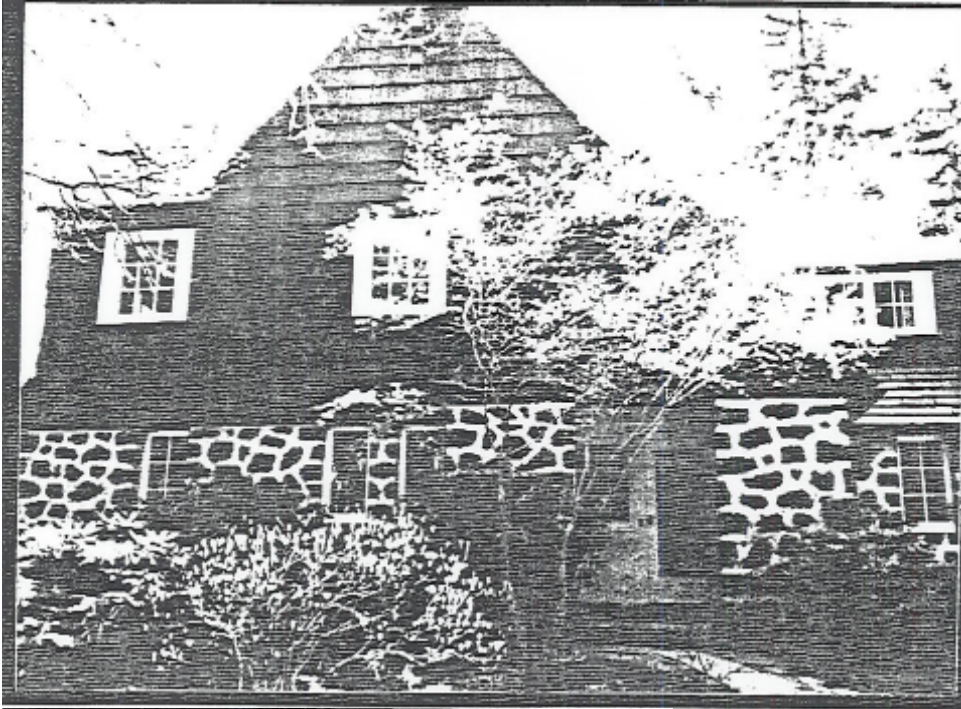

## STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE

Address: 1100 Westward Ho Road

Historic Name: Allen, Dudley, House I

This house was built in 1935 for Dudley Allen, an insurance man with the London Lancashire Company for 23 years. Allen and his wife Alma lived in the house for almost 30 years. Allen helped draw up a city ordinance on dog control in 1958 during his city council service. The house was designed by local architect Richard Sundeleaf.

The Allen House is an excellent example of Sundeleaf designs which--during this period of his career--often resembled English vernacular buildings in massing and form. Here the architect combined wide, wood shingles with uncoursed stone lending the house a rustic quality. The use of light colored mortar contrasts strongly with the stone that covers much of the first level of the house. The Allen House is quite prominent in the neighborhood because of its size and location on a rise above the street.

The Allen House is significant as a fine example of the English Cottage style, as well as for its contribution to the historic character of the Forest Hills neighborhood.
