Summary of Draft Amendments

- Contains:
 - Comprehensive plan amendments
 - TSP amendments
 - CDC amendments

TIS Guidelines, not part of the code, included for informational review

Purpose: to implement the updated TSP, clarify items in code, maintain consistency between Comp Plan-TSP-CDC together.

Intent: Create simple, but effective, transportation policy to address development and manage traffic operations

Summary of Changes

- No public comments were received
- No changes to Comp Plan amendments
- No changes to TSP amendments
- CDC changes: (from 8/8/16 PCWS)
 - Posting notification simplified
 - Increased distance to monitor traffic patterns
 - Notification to agencies “as deemed *appropriate*”
- Traffic Impact Study Guidelines: (from 8/8/16 PCWS)
 - “Emergency Vehicle Access” added to initial TIS scope

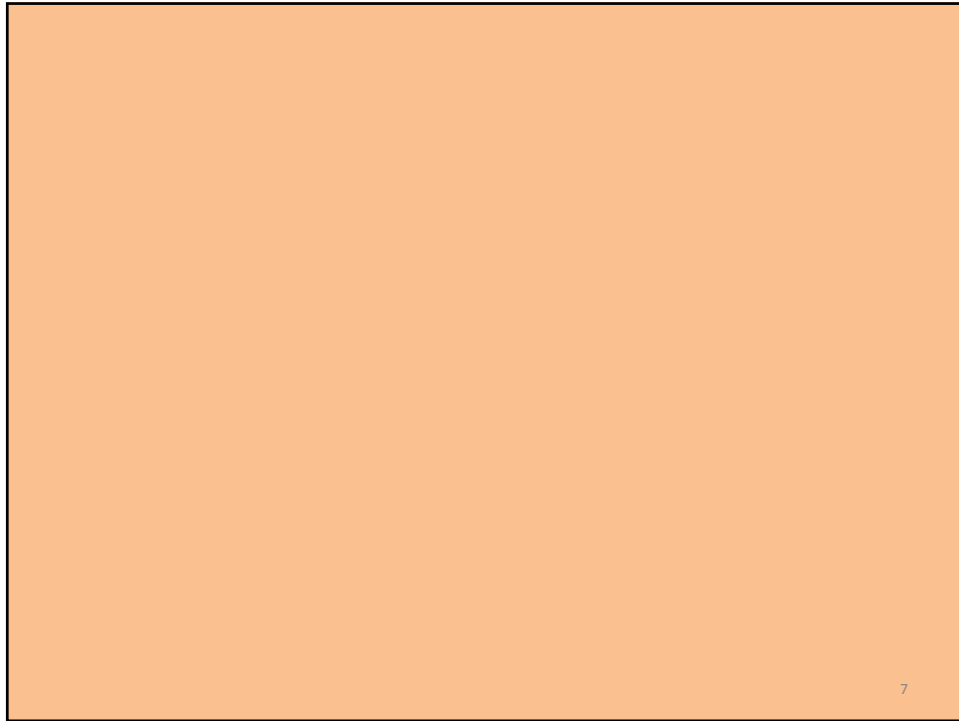

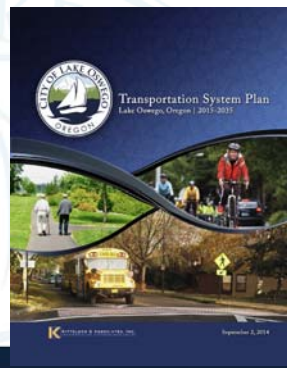
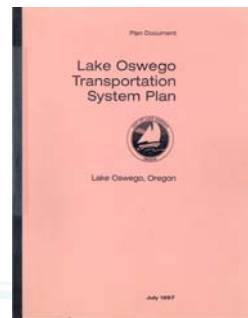

What is the TSP?

- A planning document that identifies transportation system needs and performance measures for the City's transportation network
- A component of the City's Comprehensive Plan





Purpose of the TSP

Planning

- Required by State of Oregon
- Contains TSP components typical for a city our size
- Supports coordinated planning before growth occurs

Engineering

- Informs the CIP (Capital Improvement Plan)
- Establishes eligibility for funding
- Guides improvements associated with development
- Ensures consistency in design & construction



BACKGROUND

- The TSP was updated in 2014
- Recommended amendments are the result of a 2015 audit of the CDC, TSP and Comp Plan to ensure consistency among the three documents
- Recently adopted Southwest Employment Area Plan includes street projects to be added to TSP
