Dear Ms. Hamilton,

As a Lakeridge alumni, the parent of two current Lakeridge students, and a heavily-involved athletic supporter, I wish to place my support behind the Lakeridge stadium project.

We are one of a handful of 6A high schools without adequate facilities and only one of two schools in the Three River's League that does not have covered seating. The proposed stadium project will not only enhance the atmosphere at Lakeridge sporting events, but will help keep spectators protected from the elements, especially in late fall and early spring.

I have heard that some who oppose this project believe that a new stadium will generate more traffic impact—an "if you build it, they will come" fear.

This fear is simply misplaced because unlike athletic events at the college and professional levels, high school athletic events are almost exclusively attended by each athletes' family members, by a percentage of the two student bodies, and by a small percentage of alumni, unrelated guest, friends, etc. Additional seating does not equate to additional attendance, in the context of high school athletic events, because those who typically support specific athletic teams will attend games, regardless of the condition of the facilities. Conversely, those who do not attend athletic event will not suddenly change habits, merely because there is a larger stadium in place.

The truth is that the traffic impact of a new stadium will be no more than the traffic impact Lakeridge currently faces. I sincerely hope "traffic" will not be the reason why this project is delayed. I also wish to point out that in this day and age where school improvements are funded through private donations, money is especially tight. To that end, please keep in mind that every dollar you require in additional studies for this project is actually a two dollar impact—it is a dollar the organization no longer has to spend on construction and it is a dollar that the organization must now replace.

Thank you for your attention to this matter. If I can provide you with any clarification or other information, please do not hesitate to contact me. And, please keep the record open so others who are in support of this project can also be heard.
